

Primary Education Sector Nut Policy v1

RAD-P-10



This policy applies to the below mentioned companies under Churchill Contract Services Group Holdings Ltd to include the following subsidiaries and trading names:

- Churchill Contract Catering t/a Radish (RAD)

Although we recognise that this cannot be guaranteed, Radish' aims to provide nut-free school meals following our nut policy within the Primary Education Sector. This policy serves to set out all measures to reduce the risk to those children and adults who may suffer an anaphylactic reaction if exposed to nuts to which they are sensitive.

Within the catering facilities Radish, we take precautions to minimise the risk of anaphylaxis and other allergenic reactions occurring: We never knowingly use any nuts (including pine nuts and peanuts).

- Catering staff receive regular training in respect of food allergies
- Food preparation staff take precautions to reduce the risk of cross-contamination
- Our recipes are analysed, and allergens contained therein are highlighted and recorded
- The kitchen produces a daily schedule of the safe food in respect of allergies, while the counter display menus identify allergens present in the various dishes
- All food products used in the kitchen do not contain nuts as Ingredients

However, it should be acknowledged that, given current food manufacturing processes, it is impossible to guarantee that all products will be free from possible 'traces of nuts' and other allergens.

Our suppliers provide us with nut-free products, Nevertheless, we cannot guarantee freedom from nut traces. Where we are aware of nut traces, we will identify this to our clients highlighting where ingredients "may contain" nut traces or where suppliers have confirmed that products have been manufactured in premises where nut products are present.

This policy will be formally reviewed annually and updated as required.
