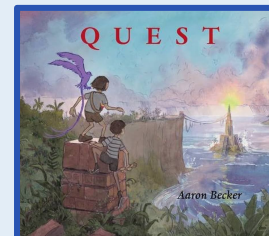
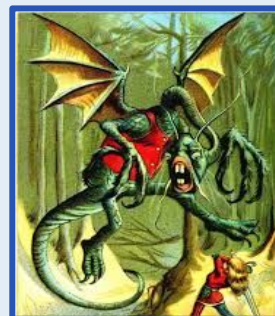

Science - Living things and their habitats

Key knowledge:

- describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common
- observable characteristics and based on similarities and differences, including microorganisms, plants and animals
- give reasons for classifying plants and animals based on specific characteristics.

Key skills:

- Ask relevant scientific questions related to classifying and grouping living things.
- Make predictions based on observable features or known classifications.
- Use careful observation to spot and record similarities and differences between living things.
- Measure and record data
- Set up comparative and fair tests testing mould growth in varying conditions
- Interpret results to draw conclusions about why organisms are grouped in particular ways.
- Explain classification decisions using scientific vocabulary and evidence from observations.

Key Vocabulary: Kingdoms, organism, microorganism, vertebrates, invertebrates, fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds, mammals, invertebrates, insects, spiders, snails, worms, flowering, nonflowering

Computing:

Create a website - Google Sites

Children will review existing websites, plan the features of their webpage and use google sites to develop their own website with multiple webpages

PSHE: Being me in my world

Key Knowledge:

- Know that I can make choices about my own behaviour because I understand how rewards and consequences feel and I understand how these relate to my rights and responsibilities
- Know how an individual's behaviour can impact on a group and how to best contribute to the group
- Know that my actions affect other people locally and globally
- Know that there are universal rights for all children but for many children these rights are not met
- Know how democracy and having a voice benefits the school community and how to participate in this
- Know how to identify my goals for this year, understand my fears and worries about the future and know how to express them

Music:

Key Knowledge:

- The location of Brazil and the Amazon (continent, hemisphere, equator, tropics...)
- A tropical rainforest is a biome with a fast-moving water cycle
- What the day in the life of an Amazonian person is like
- Mining in the Amazon - where are natural resources found and how are they used?
- Other causes of deforestation and its impact.
