Parent Teacher Consultations

This year's parent teacher consultations will be focusing on pupil's learning behaviours and will be conducted via Zoom. Teachers will be providing parents with a 21st Century skills report on their child which can be discussed during the consultation.

Parents will be able to **book appointments from 10.30 am on Monday morning until Tuesday 5th October via Ping**. A notification will be sent out via Ping prior to this which will outline instructions. Some parents will be contacted today with pre allocated time slots.

I want to give parents advance warning that <u>the school day will end earlier on Wednesday 6th October</u> to allow Parent Teacher Consultations appointments to start at 1.30 pm. Information regarding dismissal arrangements on Wednesday the 6th October will be sent out to parents on Monday 27th September.

As part of our ongoing school improvement, the Core Leadership Team have been reviewing the way we undertake assessment and the providers we use. Following these discussions, we have opted to use a different assessment package for this academic year. This means that you will not receive GL Assessment reports this month or in March like in previous years.

Instead, we will have termly assessments, carried out in November, March and June for Year 1 to Year 6. The assessments will cover spelling, punctuation and grammar, maths and reading comprehension. Following these assessments, a report will be sent to you with a summary of the three areas mentioned; they are similar in content to the previous ones shared last academic year. Year 1 and 2 will carry out their assessments on paper and these can be marked in-house, meaning results can be shared with you more quickly than before. Years 3-6 will complete these on laptops, much like last year. The timings of these assessments mean that a greater amount of curriculum content will have been taught, resulting in a more accurate understanding of areas of strength and development for your child. The package we are now using has also undergone national standardisation in 2021, meaning we are able to understand how our children are performing nationally post-COVID.

While these reports will be shared three times a year, assessment is an ongoing process within school. Teachers have been and continue to assess within lessons to ascertain where each child is working at and what next steps are needed. We look forward to being able to share these reports with you in November and discussing how your child has settled into school at our upcoming Parent-Teacher consultations in early October.

COVID Response Guidance

Please read below the procedures that we are required to take in relation to COVID cases in the school. To remain as safe and healthy as we possibly can, we would like to remind you of some of the things we can do as a school community.

- We would be grateful if children and parents could regularly test themselves with lateral flow tests. All staff
 members are testing themselves twice a week.
- Please make sure that your child has everything they need so that you don't have to come into school to deliver things once you have left the site.

In terms of tracing close contacts of COVID cases and the need to self-isolate the government guidance (confirmed by the borough) is as follows:

- Settings only needed to do contact tracing up to and including 18 July.
- Close contacts will now be identified via NHS Test and Trace and education settings will no longer be expected to undertake contact tracing.
- As with positive cases in any other setting, NHS Test and Trace will work with the positive case and/or their parent/carer to identify close contacts.
- Contacts from a school setting will only be traced by NHS Test and Trace where the positive case and/or their
 parent specifically identifies the individual as being a close contact. This is likely to be a small number of
 individuals who would be most at risk of contracting COVID-19 due to the nature of the close contact.
- You may be contacted in exceptional cases to help with identifying close contacts, as currently happens in managing other infectious diseases.
- Individuals are not required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, and any of the following apply:
 - they are fully vaccinated
 - o they are below the age of 18 years and 6 months
 - o they have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial
 - o they are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

Instead, they will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a <u>PCR test</u>. We **would encourage all individuals to take a PCR test if advised to do so**.

Staff who do not need to isolate, and children and young people aged under 18 years 6 months who usually attend school, and have been identified as a close contact, should continue to attend school as normal. They do not need to wear a face covering within the school, but it is expected and recommended that these are worn when travelling on public or dedicated transport.

As before, please make sure that you take your child for a **PCR test** (<u>not a lateral flow test</u>) if: There is a recent onset of any of the following:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

As you can appreciate, we have to follow the guidance that we are given as a school.

In the event of a rise in cases we also have a contingency framework which we will follow to keep everyone safe.

Illness and absence

We would like to remind parents of our policy regarding absences.

If your child is absent for any reason, you must inform the school office via absence@vineyard.richmond.sch.uk by 8:30am

If your child has any of the three main symptoms of COVID (cough, temperature, loss of taste/smell), they must stay off school and have a PCR test done (not a lateral flow). As soon as you receive them, you must forward the results onto absence@vineyard.richmond.sch.uk. If negative, the child may return to school when well enough. If positive, the child must isolate for 10 days from the onset of symptoms. Siblings of COVID positive pupils may come to school if they do not have any symptoms, although we strongly recommend they are regularly tested with lateral flow tests while their sibling is unwell.

If your child has a bout of **vomiting or diarrhoea**, they **must not come into school for 48 hours** from the last bout.

If your child has a medical appointment during school hours, please inform the school office via absence@vineyard.richmond.sch.uk and include proof of appointment e.g. hospital letter, appointment confirmation email/text from the GP

Letter from Radish

As with several other companies around the country, our catering company Radish has been affected by supply issues. A message was sent out on Ping this week by Mr Rosewell with and update from Radish that they provided to the school. To see the full message please login to your Ping account.

"What is Radish doing to mitigate supplier shortages or delivery failures?

- Preparing We will be bulk buying our dry store and freezer stock and monitoring it regularly.
- Organising We are ordering goods with a 3 -4-day lead time to ensure we have time to get the items redelivered or sourced with an alternative supplier.
- Back up Planning Our Onsite catering teams will ensure at all times there is stock available to make an emergency lunch in case we have a complete delivery failure, this will ensure that we are still able to provide your child(ren) with a hot nutritious meal. Please note: The emergency lunch will cater to all pupils including those with special dietary requirements.
 - Communicating Our teams have been constantly communicating to ensure we have the best plans and options available to our Catering Managers."

The Vineyard School PTA is very excited to launch a new recycling initiative by Astra Recycling and welcome a shiny new recycling box at our school! The textile/clothes collection box is situated on the driveway right next to the PTA beach hut.




