## COVID Response Guidance - Reminder

Please read below the procedures that we are required to take in relation to COVID cases in the school.

- We would be grateful if **children and parents could regularly test themselves** with lateral flow tests. All **staff members are testing themselves twice a week**.
- Please make sure that **your child has everything they need so that you don't have to come into school to deliver things** once you have left the site.

In terms of tracing close contacts of COVID cases and the need to self-isolate the government guidance (confirmed by the borough) is as follows:

- **Close contacts will now be identified via NHS Test and Trace** and education settings will no longer be expected to undertake contact tracing.
- As with positive cases in any other setting, NHS Test and Trace will work with the positive case and/or their parent/carer to identify close contacts.
- Contacts from a school setting will only be traced by NHS Test and Trace where the positive case and/or their parent specifically identifies the individual as being a close contact. This is likely to be a small number of individuals who would be most at risk of contracting COVID-19 due to the nature of the close contact.
- You may be contacted in exceptional cases to help with identifying close contacts, as currently happens in managing other infectious diseases.
- Individuals are not required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, and any of the following apply:
  - they are fully vaccinated
  - they are below the age of 18 years and 6 months
  - they have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial
  - they are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

Instead, they will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a **PCR test**. We **would encourage all individuals to take a PCR test if advised to do so**.

Staff who do not need to isolate, and children and young people aged under 18 years 6 months who usually attend school, and have been identified as a close contact, should continue to attend school as normal. They do not need to wear a face covering within the school, but it is expected and recommended that these are worn when travelling on public or dedicated transport.

As before, please make sure that you take your child for a **PCR test (not a lateral flow test)** if:

There is a recent onset of any of the following:

- a **new continuous cough**
- a **high temperature**
- a **loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)**

As you can appreciate, we have to follow the guidance that we are given as a school. Thank you for your continued support.

## Year 6 and Reception NCMP

On **Monday 13<sup>th</sup> December**, our school nurses from Richmond Borough will be coming to the school to **measure Year 6 and Reception pupils' height and weight**. This is part of a program that takes place each year to monitor pupil health.

A message was sent out on Ping last week with further information, including **where to sign up to receive your child's results** and **how to opt out** if you wish.

If Year 6 and Reception parents have not already, please could you sign up to the service or, if you do not wish for your child to be measured, **alternatively opt out**.

## Wellbeing practitioner courses

Don't forget that we have a great **Children's Wellbeing Practitioner**, who comes into school every week to **offer parents courses on Managing Children's Anxiety and Managing Children's Behaviour**. The courses are **6-8 weeks long** and are run **just with you**; this is not a group programme. If this is of interest and you would like more information, please contact Mrs Axbey or Miss Wakefield.

We kindly ask that parents ensure children have everything they need for the school day before leaving home.

## Reception Hearing Screening

On **Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> November, Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> November and Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> November**, Reception children will be undertaking their hearing screening. Children are offered a routine hearing screen as part of the School Health Screening Programme during their reception year at school. The main aim of the hearing screening programme is to identify children who have a hearing loss. One of our school screeners will be visiting to carry out a routine hearing screen.

A message was sent out earlier this week via Ping with full information, please see some main points below.

During the screen, sounds will be presented through headphones and your child will be asked to play a simple game when they hear the sound. The screen only takes a few minutes to complete.

If your child requires a further assessment, you will be informed by a letter.

Following the COVID 19 pandemic, all screeners will be dressed in appropriate personal protective equipment and will adhere to infection control procedures for all equipment used.

If you do not want your child to be screened, please let the school know immediately. If you do not opt out before the screeners visit, then it is assumed that you have agreed to the hearing screen.

If your child has regular audiology follow up appointments at their local clinic, under an Ear, Nose and Throat Department or if your child has a PVP shunt inserted, please inform the school so that your child is not screened.

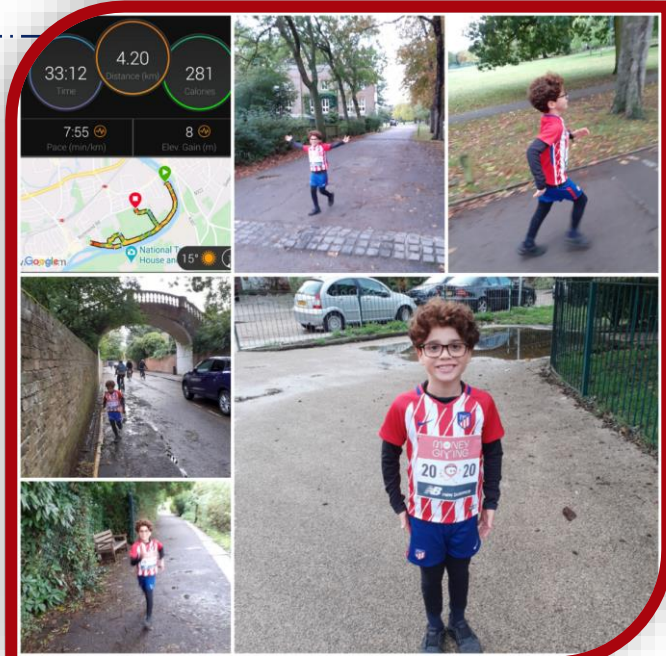

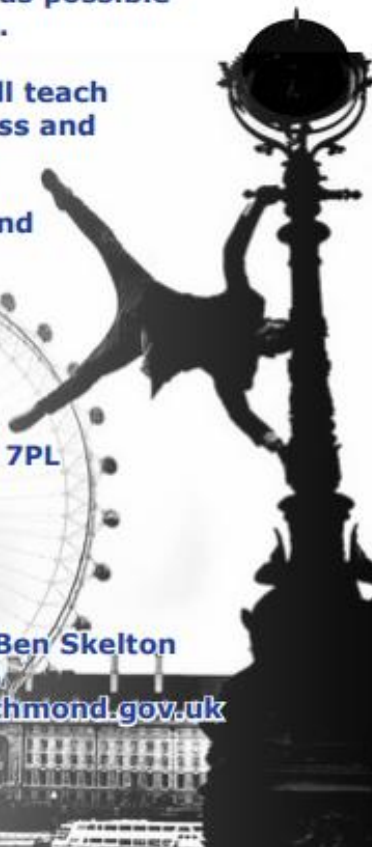
