Reception

This week in Reception the children have been sharing their favourite books with each other, retelling their best parts of the story. Our writing activity this week was based on their favourite book where the children wrote the name of their book and why they liked it. On Tuesday, Reception had a special visit from the famous author and illustrator Momoko Abe looking at her book 'The Avocado Asks'.

Year 1

Year 3

We have had a busy and exciting week in Year 3 this week reading and listening to some amazing stories! We were lucky enough to have a workshop with Simon Mole and learnt how to write some excellent poems about Kites. Our SPARK Book Clubs also began this week and we have dived into 'The Last Bear' by Hannah Gold. It has been wonderful to hear the children so engaged and excited about their reading. Year 3 have also enjoyed their trip to The National Maritime Museum where we explored the 'Tudor and Stuart Seafarers' gallery, the 'All Hands' gallery and even got to get our hands on some real Tudor artefacts. The children learnt so much!

Year 4

This week Year 4 have really enjoyed Book Week and the wonderful Book events that have taken place. Year 4 asked plenty of interesting questions to our visiting authors, including Jen Carney who wrote 'The accidental diary of B.U.G.' Jen Carney explained why she wrote the book, who influenced her and how she developed the different characters. We were also lucky enough to have an art lesson with Jen Carney, whereby each child drew one of the main characters.

Year 5 & 6

On Tuesday, we had a hilarious poetry session with Simon Mole in which we wrote our own odes about something we love (ducks, popcorn, pepperoni pizza and even dim sum). The next day, on the 2nd of March we made book marks, which we laminated and got to keep or gift to another book lover! To end this book-filled week we had Tasmin Mori, who ran a session about Myths and Legends, to make this session even more enthralling we were dressed as our favourite book character!
