Class News

Reception

Reception have had a very exciting few weeks! The children have all been thoroughly enjoying getting stuck into nature, and doing forest school with Mrs Balaram. They loved making journey sticks and being in a new environment that they could explore! Reception have been learning about Minibeasts and have loved finding them in the learning garden and learning some facts about them. We also had an exciting visit from ZooLab, who showed us some exotic animals. We were completely engrossed, and the animals were unusual ones. We were very brave when holding the Madagascan cockroach!

Year 1

We have had a great week in Year 1 and are becoming laptop experts! We have written sentences using a word processor (google docs) and have experimented by editing text in creative ways. In science we have carried out exciting tests to investigate the properties of different materials. In English we are preparing to write a book next week, and in art we have taken inspiration from Vincent Van Gough and painted our own Starry Night.

Year 2

Year 2 have had a busy week learning about poems We have read Owl and the Pussycat and it has been so fun! In English we learnt about Simon Mole and he taught us how to rhyme and make our own nonsense words, we even made a nonsense dictionary. In science, we learnt about the UK weather and made our own weather report, we even acted it out. In art, we designed our own vases based on Kate Malone's beautiful pottery work.

Year 3

I think you will all agree that Year 3 have truly shone this week in their spectacular assemblies! A huge thank you to all the parents and guardians that came along to watch their fantastic performances. Leading on from this, the children have been making an outstanding effort with their presentation this week by publishing their letters to the Tear Thief. We have just finished our unit on fractions in maths and the children have even been challenging themselves to work out equivalent fractions! In science this week, we had a magnificent time investigating how magnetic forces by creating our own games using our paper race tracks, magnets and paper clips. We continue to build our geographical knowledge of North America, by exploring the cold, continental landscape of Alberta, Canada and will be contrasting this next week to the landscape of Florida, USA.

Year 4

The sunshine has come a perfect time for our new English text Hot Like Fire by Valerie Bloom. The children have been discussing the interesting Jamaican dialect used by the poet and creating poems about their own lives. They have also been learning so much about the rivers of the world in book club. Science is linking in well with geography as we are considering both the human and natural impacts on our environments and we are making the most of the good weather with athletics and fielding activities in PE. The classes had have the opportunity to show their dramatic sides when re-enacting the exciting story of Rama and Sita to show their understanding of the significance of the celebration for Diwali for Hindus and Sikhs. There has also been more creativity shown in sewing skills, inspired by the artist Frances Pickering. Finally, a big thank you to all the parents that were able to attend the assemblies last week. It seems such a long time that the children have been able to take part in such as event and we were impressed that they rose to the occasion!

Year 5

Recently in Year 5 we have had a big focus on planning our field work for our trip to Richmond Park. To get ready, this week we completed some tree surveys of the school grounds and decided on whether our trees were deciduous or not. In Art we have continued to develop our skills for our self-portraits, focussing on mixing colours and working out their symbolism as well as practising drawing facial features. In English we have thoroughly enjoyed creatively writing about London using the book 'This is London', we have developed and published our descriptions using illustrations too. In Maths we have started our new topic, Properties of Shape. We have been revising different types of angles, comparing them and learning how to use a protractor to measure them accurately. We are super excited for our trip to Richmond Park next week!

Year 6 have been extremely busy this week completing SATS. We are proud of the effort they put in and their calm attitude. In writing, they have been creating a set of instructions based on the novel 'The Explorer'. In computing all year 6 students have been coding their own catching game using scratch.
